

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES FOR MOORINGS
WEST POINT OF LONG ISLAND ASSOCIATION

October 11, 2012

1. There are 10 State regulated moorings that are the property of the West Point of Long Island Association.
2. Members requesting a mooring must be members in good standing with all dues and assessments paid in full.
3. There will be one mooring per household.
4. You may have one mooring or one dock space but not both.
5. There will be a \$1,500.00 reimbursement payment that will be refunded within 60 days of mooring termination.
6. An annual fee, structured on the budgeted expenses, will be assessed and collected with the user's annual dues
7. The only boat allowed on the mooring is the one that is registered with the State for that mooring.
8. Available moorings will be assigned from a waiting list. To be on the waiting list you must be a member in good standing and the Mooring Master must be notified in writing of your request
9. When a mooring becomes available, you may accept the mooring, you may refuse the mooring and be assigned to the bottom of the list or you may be removed from the list.
10. If you have a mooring you must send a copy of your boat registration to the Mooring Master on or before April 1st each year.
11. If you have a mooring you must have your boat off the mooring by October 15th.
12. The maximum boat length allowed on the mooring is 26 feet. A copy of the **"Manufacturer's Specifications"** indicating a length over all (LOA) not to exceed 26 feet must be provided to the Mooring Master prior to the first use of the mooring.
13. If any mooring is not occupied by the assigned user on June 15th, the assigned user will be contacted. If immediate utilization does not occur the mooring will be assigned for temporary use from June 15 to July 1. Aside from extenuating circumstances, if the mooring remains unoccupied by the assigned user on July 1, the reassignment process will proceed. The assigned user's name will be placed at the end of the mooring waiting list.
14. There are times when damage or tired material repair/replacement costs will exceed the balance in the Mooring Fund and therefore require special assessments to be issued to all mooring users. These costs will be paid by the mooring users (10) with no Association contribution.
